Injury Observations:

- Home injuries were high in 2011/2012. This was the highest in location areas of injury
- Falling incidents through loss of balance significant
- Local paths and walkways highlighted as a high risk factor
- Wairoa has a high level of Motor Vehicle injuries which is almost double of the country average.
- Wairoa has a high level of Motorcyle injury causes. It must be noted that there have been considerable farming environment accidents.
- Wairoa assaults resulting in injury is double the national average
- Public place assaults are high
- Water sport injuries are moderate but 26% of national average
- Work injury indicators are rising
- Assault injury indicators are falling
- · Water sports injury indicators are falling
- Fall rate indicators are rising
- Motor vehicle trend is rising
